As a result, lowa City is often placed on "best-place-to-live" listings in numerous national magazines. Iowa City prizes itself on its diverse population and intellectual resources. The Writers' Workshop at the University of Iowa is a world renowned writing program that aspiring writers compete to gain acceptance to. The University of Iowa also has

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

## Housing

The Iowa City/ Coralville area has many options for places to live. Renting an apartment or house of your own, living in University of Iowa housing, or purchasing your own home are just some of the options that are available.

The <u>Daily lowan</u>, the <u>Press</u> <u>Citizen</u>, and the <u>Cedar Rapids Gazette</u> (all local newspapers) are some of the best places to start your search for housing.

One bedroom apartments that are located near campus will cost between \$400 and \$600 per month. The prices tend to drop the further the apartment is from campus. Two bedroom apartments are generally in the \$490-\$650 per month range.

The University of Iowa has a Family Services Office Housing and Relocation department with many good resources for people who are just moving into the area. The Housing Clearinghouse is a free service for rental properties in the Iowa City/ Coralville area. See also the housing information on the

Iowa City/Coralville Area Online Resource website for more information about the area, local realtors, financing and more.

The University has housing available for graduate students, generally at a cheaper rate. <u>University Housing</u>: The Family Housing and University apartments are generally for graduate students and foreign scholars.

It is usually a good idea to compare several different apartments before settling on one. Landlords should not hesitate to schedule an appointment for you to tour the apartment you are interested in.

Deposits on rental properties are often one month's rent. The actual price depends on the property and the landlord. Your deposit ensures that when you move out your landlord will have some money to pay for any damages or cleaning that needs to be done before the next tenant moves in. The money that is left over from your deposit should be returned to you after your lease agreement

has ended.

Remember to ask the landlord what utilities are included in your rent, and what

utilities you will be responsible for paying. Some apartments also have an extra fee for parking.

Subletting an apartment is allowed by most landlords in the Iowa City/Coralville area.

If you think that you might want to live in the same place for longer than a year, ask your landlord if having a two year lease would be possible. By having a two year lease you can have more of a fixed rental price.

lowa City and Coralville have quite the selection of grocery stores. The New Pioneer Co-Op and Tait's features organically and locally grown foods. Another place to get locally grown food is at the lowa City Farmer's Market that takes place from May through October at Chauncey Swan Park.

Hy-Vee, Fareway, Cub Foods, and Aldi's are some of the larger grocery

stores in the state of lowa. Hy-Vee has numerous locations in lowa City and one store in Coralville. Cub Foods is located on Highway 6, as is Aldi's. Fareway has two locations in lowa City, one on the east side of lowa City and one on the west side. Other places for grocery shopping include the Super Wal-Mart in Coralville and John's Grocery in lowa City. Chong's, a Korean grocery store, and

East-West Oriental Foods are good places to find many Asian cooking materials. <u>Tayeeb Afro-Oriental Foods</u> on 2nd Aveune in Coralville offers groceries from the Middle East. There are also many middle eastern and Indian grocers located in Coralville

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#### Getting around town...

lowa City and its surrounding areas are easily accessible by foot, bike, bus, and car, so how to get to work in the morning is something to consider. If you ask around you are sure to get many different answers. Some lab members choose to live close to the laboratory so that they can walk or ride their bike in to work each morning. Others will tell you that driving is the best way to get to work, though the parking may leave you a bit flustered. The rest of the people will tell you to ride one of the busses.

There are three different busses that run in the Iowa City/Coralville area. The Cambus is operated by the Uni-

versity of lowa and is available free of charge for everyone traveling around campus. The lowa City transit and the Coralville transit systems cover much of the area that the Cambus does not, but for a small fee. City bus passes are available at a reduced rate for University and HHMI employees.

Some of the conveniences to walking, biking, or riding the bus are that you do not have to worry about paying for parking on campus, trying to find a parking spot, or dealing with the rush hour traffic. However, it can be very useful to have a car for going grocery shopping, going to see a movie, or so that you can leave town to visit some of the attractions that lowa and it's neighboring states have to offer.

## Why didn't they warn me?

For people joining the Campbell Laboratory from outside of the United States, it might be convenient to have cash available for the first month that you are here.

It is also good idea to try to build a credit history as soon as you are able. "When I first arrived, I couldn't get any kind of regular credit card. My recommendation is to get a "secured" credit card," says Aaron Beedle, Ph.D., a Postdoctoral fellow from Canada. The typical procedure is to fill out an application and send the company a check. They will deposit your money in an account and send you a credit

card with the credit limit set at the amount you sent (e.g. if you send them \$500, they will give you a card with a \$500 limit). They keep your money in an account. After a year (or maybe sooner), you can call and ask them to convert your secured card to a regular credit card. If you've been paying all your bills on time, you should get approved. Then they will send you a regular card and will send back your "secured" money (e.g. the \$500). You are then on your way to building credit in the U.S.

Having good credit can help you to get financing to make larger purchases a such as a car or a home. Good credit even helps with smaller needs such as cell phone contracts.



## **Entertainment in Iowa City**

No matter what you like to do for fun, there is always a selection of things to do in Iowa City and its surrounding area. Although Iowa does not have a professional sports team, Iowa City is home to the University of Iowa Hawkeyes. The Hawkeyes are part of the Big 10 conference which is one of the premier collegiate sports conferences in the United States. The Hawkeyes play a variety of popular sports including, gymnastics, soccer, tennis, basketball, and American football. The <u>IceHawks</u> are a club hockey team affiliated with the University that compete during the fall and winter. In 2005 they were their conference champions. Home games are played at the Coral Ridge Mall ice rink and admission is free.

During the fall, many people enjoy (American) football games, and not just for the action on the field. Tailgating\* is as much an activity in Iowa City as the game itself. When the Hawkeyes are having a home football game you will find many parties going on and a lot of people dressed in black and gold, the school's colors.

There are many places to go shopping. The Pedes-Mall trian downtown lowa City features many unique, oneof-a-kind stores, from jewelry to home décor. The Old Capital Town Center is also located in downtown Iowa City. Sycamore Mall is on the east side of Iowa City Highway 6. Coral

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## **Dining**

There are times when you really do not feel like making dinner. When you are in Iowa City and Coralville this is not a problem. There are numerous restaurants where you can purchase a delicious meal.

If you are in the mood for President Bill Sushi Popo, the Peking restaurant. Buffet, and Thai Spice.

Takanami and Sushi Popo specialize in making sushi for the Iowa City community. Hunan and the Peking Buffet serve mainly Mandarin dishes. Thai Spice and Thai Flavors prepare some of the best Thai food in Iowa City. The Three Samurai is a Japanese restaurant that combines a spectacle for the eyes and a feast for the palate. Indian dishes are served at Masala and the India Café.

Almost all of the restaurants in the Iowa City/Coralville area serve dishes that do not contain meat. The Red Avocado and Lou Henri are two of Iowa City's vegetarian restaurants. Other good choices for vegetarian meals are Oasis Falafel and Z'Marik Noodle Café.

## **Traveling in Iowa**

When people first think of lowa most often they picture fields of corn; however, lowa has much more to offer than

Coralville Lake and Lake McBride State Park are both excellent places to go fishing, hiking, and boating, just make sure to stop and get your fishing license first. There are many state parks and lakes in lowa where the fishing is superb. Iowa also allows some types of hunting; you will want to make sure to get a hunting license first. lowa is full of many natural resources. There are over 50 state parks (for a complete list click here). Many of the state parks allow fishing, camping, swimming, boating, and they often have hiking trails. Some of the parks even have caves (caverns) complete with stalactites and stalagmites. Maquoketa caves, north of Davenport, has trails that lead you through many different caves. Crystal Lake Cave, south of Dubuque, is a living cave that currently gives tours. There is also Cold-

If you like life above ground, you might like to pick up a map of lowa, jump in the car, and start driving. Just to the northwest of Iowa City there are a group of towns known as the Amana colonies. The Amanas were started by German settlers. Today the towns host many different stores, and they welcome visitors. To the southwest of Iowa City is the town of Kalona. In Kalona you can learn more about the Amish community that has settled in that area and their way of life. There are shops in Kalona that feature handmade furniture, handmade quilts, and various other goodies. About two hours north of Iowa City, is the town of Dyersville (map). Dyersville was the film location for the movie "Field of Dreams." The film site is still open to the public, and there are often baseball games played on the field.

The Mississippi River is the longest river in the United States, and it makes up the entire eastern border of lowa. The Mississippi River road can also be a good place to go for a drive in the fall. You are able to see many of the leaves on the trees changing colors, and you are often able to spot bald eagles, the national bird. Click here for ideas on where to view the bald eagle.

Another good way to see the state of lowa is to ride on the Register's Annual Great Bicycle

Ride Across o w a (RAGBRAI). RAGBRAI was started in 1973 as a challenge between two of the Des Moines Register's reporters. Since then RAGBRAI has grown in

size and scope. People from across the globe come each year to join in the annual bike

ride across the state. The course for RAGBRAI changes each year, that way all parts of the state get to host the riders. RAGBRAI takes place each summer, and the course always starts on the western border of lowa



later on the eastern border at the Mississippi River. Many RAGBRAI enthusiasts dip their rear tire into the Missouri River before starting off and then end the trek by dipping their front tire in the Mississippi River.

There are also many opportunities to rent a canoe along many of lowa's rivers. Other outdoor activities include water skiing in the summer and cross country skiing in the winter. Some people have even found opportunities to go diving in some of the quarries.

One of lowa's largest activities is the lowa State fair that takes place in Des Moines every August for two weeks. The

Iowa State fair is a showcase of livestock, food, crafts, games, shows, and many other treats. The Iowa State fair boasts an attendance of over one million people each year and is nationally acclaimed. It attracts people from all over the Midwest, the nation, and persons living abroad. Some of the most advertised sights at the fair are the "Largest Hog" contest, the Butter Cow, and the Ugliest Cake con-

The Ledges State Park, located 4 miles south of Boone, Iowa, is a park that has been carved out of limestone deposits by

running water. The Ledges has many hiking and walking trails. It also features numerous picnicking spots, fishing, and camping. As you drive up to the Ledges there is a lot of flat farmland. Then almost out of nowhere you come to a grove of trees. Hiding behind these trees is a roadway with many twists and steep drops that leads you down into the bottom of the Ledges. When you reach the bottom and step out of your vehicle, it is hard to imagine that this place really exists in Iowa. These cliffs are truly a wondrous sight, made even more special by being right in the heart of the state.

If you enjoy going to parks like this, then Palisades Kepler State Park near Cedar Rapids has hiking trails. Wildcat Den State Park also has trails and historic buildings located on the park property.

Mercy has personalized assistance to help you find a doctor and make an appointment. You can contact Mercy On Call at 358-2767 or 800-358-2767. They employ registered nurses who will help you locate the services appropriate to your situation.

There are also family practice doctors that are in the Iowa City area that are not part of the University. It is important that you ensure that the doctor you see will accept your health insurance so that you will not be required to pay a large medical bill. If you are a University employee this usually means that it is best for you to see a doctor at one of the University clinics. If you are an HHMI employee, it might be a good idea to ask another HHMI lab member where they go to the doctor, as some HHMI employees use Mercy services.

Dentists and Optometrists can also be an important part of staying healthy. Most dentists are able to treat children, adults, and geriatric patients. Your dental insurance often helps you to pay for your dental expenses. Make sure that the dentist you visit accepts your dental insurance. Opticians are able to diagnose astigmatisms, cataracts, and other eye related problems. If you have vision insurance it will typically help cover the

costs of eye exams and corrective lenses

In addition to doctors and dentists, there are many alternative medical treatments available. Chiropractors diagnose and treat patients whose health problems are associated with the body's muscular, nervous, and skeletal systems, especially the spine. day where it is 65°F (18°C) and sunny, and then the next morning wake up to find that it will only be 40°F (4°C) and raining. Weather can also change dramatically throughout the day during any season. In the summers it can get very hot and humid. During the winters there is often snow and ice, as well as very cold temperatures to endure.

During the spring (March-May) Iowa has many rainstorms, and it is not uncommon to have fog on some mornings. The spring months also mark the beginning of severe weather. The temperatures often fluctuate greatly during these months. Mornings are often cool, afternoons can be warm, sometimes hot. Because of this, there are increased chances for severe weather.

The spring and summer months are often marked with periods of thunderstorms. Sometimes these storms will have hail, or even tornados. Severe weather warnings are announced on the local television and radio stations. If there is a tornado warning issued, the tornado sirens will sound, that means to take cover as a tornado is possible. It is a good idea to have a radio that will run on batteries in case your power goes out. Radio station 600AM has continustorm coverage during severe

storms

Iowa City will sound two different sirens at the same time if a tornado is imminent. Taking shelter in the lowest spot available is highly advised. Stay away from windows, and remember to protect your head with blankets, pillows, or even a mattress. Tornados are unpredictable and are very dangerous.

Signs to watch for:

- \* A sickly greenish or greenish black color to the sky.
- \* If there is a watch or warning posted, then the fall of hail should be considered as a real danger sign.
- \* A strange quiet that occurs within or shortly after the thunderstorm.
- \* Clouds moving by very fast, especially in a rotating pattern or converging toward one area of the sky.
- \* A sound a little like a waterfall or rushing air at first, but turning into a roar as it comes closer. The sound of a tornado has been likened to that of Mild days during fall are both railroad trains and jets.
- \* Debris dropping from the sky.
- \* An obvious "funnel-shaped" cloud that is rotating, or debris such as branches or leaves being pulled upwards, even if no funnel cloud is visible.

lowa winters can be just as unpredictable as the lowa spring and summer. Winter in Iowa is often marked with heavy snow falls and ice. There are times when conditions are just right, and an ice storm will occur. The temperatures can also drop well below freezing. During the winter it is important to remember that because of the wind, it often is

colder than the actual temperature. Having a good warm coat, gloves, and boots are essential for lowa winters. At times the weather during the winter makes traveling unadvisable. Local television and radio stations will announce school and business closings due to the inclement weather. They will also announce if roads are being closed because of dangerous driving conditions.

#### Taxes

When you start a job in the United States you are required to fill out certain tax forms such as a W-4. The person who gives you these forms, whether from the University of HHMI, should be able to help you with any questions you have concerning them.

At the beginning of each year, people in America start preparing to file their state

and federal taxes. The U.S. government requires that all persons living inside the United States pay taxes on their income. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) handles the tax returns that are filed. Federal tax returns are due on April 15 every year.

There are special rules for foreign students and scholars that are filing tax

> returns. The Office of International Students & Scholars (OISS) provides tax assistance beginning in February each year. Check their website for more information about taxation. For detailed information concerning forms, exemptions, and income reporting the IRS has a website that provides much of this information.

All persons who earn money in lowa, must file a State of Iowa income tax return. There is a line on the tax return that allows for non-resident credit. There is an additional form that must be filled out in order to figure the amount of credit you will receive. The State of lowa has all of the forms and instructions available on their website.

If you want help filing your tax returns there are services available. While some tax preparation services are free, many of them charge fees. The lowa Department of Revenue has links to some online tax preparation services, and the OISS offers tax-filing software and classes in the spring to help with tax

The local public library will have tax forms and instructions available for free.
